II. Primary Grades Uniform Policy

Uniforms must be clean, proper and free of wrinkles. Students not dressed appropriately will not be permitted to participate in school events, including those not meeting the expectations for given "dressdown" days.

SHOES	 ALL: plain all-black flat dress or tennis shoes that cover heel, have all black soles, and have all black laces and/or a back strap NOTE: Tennis shoes must be all black, including soles. Logos or markings that are a different color but are less than the size of a quarter (any shape) will be permitted 	 Girls' heeled or open-back dress shoes Boots are not permitted to be worn in the classroom. III. Homework Policy

Homework is a very important part of the instruction at St. Marcus. Homework is given to help reinforce skills, concepts, and ideas learned in class. PRACTICE, PRACTICE, PRACTICE! The majority of grades students receive will reflect their mastery of grade-level skills, and is derived from in-class assessments.

If a scholar is absent from school, please allow the teacher at least 24 hours to gather and send work home.

More detailed information on a class's homework policy including information on corrections, missing/late homework, and absent work will be outlined in the class syllabus provided by the lead teacher before the school year begins.

IV. Behavior Programs, Policies & Procedures

St. Marcus is driven by its mission to disciple children for Christ, now and for all eternity, and to train them in excellence for their roles in their family, church, community, workplace and country. A wonderful Bible verse that represents our behavioral philosophy is "Train a child in the way he should go and when he is old he will not turn from it." Proverbs 22:6. In order to achieve our mission, school leaders and teachers establish routines and procedures with high behavioral expectations that result in a secure, respectful and productive learning environment.

The behavioral programs and parent communication plans will be appropriately unique to the student's age groups as follows: Early Childhood (K3), Kindergarten (K4-K5), Primary Grades (1st-4th Grades), and Middle School (5th-8th Grades). Occasionally we review, evaluate and tweak the behavioral programs in order to ensure we are doing our job to uphold our mission and do what is best for our students. Behavioral programs and their supporting policies and procedures will be rolled out each school year during home visits or parent meetings and may be reiterated throughout the year via written school communications.
